But modern rhetoric suggests that the author makes a mask for the audience as well. Both Wayne Booth and Walter Ong have suggested that the author's audience is always a fiction. And Edwin Black refers to the rhetorical concept of audience as 'the second persona.' Reader-response theory speaks of 'implied' and 'ideal' audiences.
